In that spirit, and the spirit of improving communications, we would like to take this opportunity to clarify the Board's role in representing the interests of our community, specifically surrounding wastewater issues.

The Briar Chapel Community Association always has and always will represent the interests of our community's homeowners on wastewater issues. The BCCA has intervened with the North Carolina Utilities Commission and spoken in opposition to the Chatham County Commissioners on potential regionalization of the Briar Chapel wastewater system. The BCCA intends to continue to take appropriate steps, legally and otherwise, to oppose regionalization of our community wastewater system, protecting the interests of our Association and the community we serve.

As BCCA and Stop Chatham North's end goals are aligned, we think that a dialogue between the BCCA board and Stop Chatham North would be useful. To that end, Liz Rolison and Jerry Cole met with representatives of Stop Chatham North to discuss how both groups can work together to serve our community. It was agreed that discussions toward more efficient and effective collaboration will continue.

We hope this statement is welcomed by the community and moves us towards building a stronger voice on the future direction of our community's wastewater system.
