### 1. Meeting Report from December 8th 2022

- December 8<sup>th</sup> 2022 meeting report has been approved and posted on the community website.

### 2. ONSWC Update—John McDonald

- WWTP expansion update  
Plant is fully operational. ONSWC is working through final punch list, including final grading once the weather is drier.
- Odor control improvements  
Odor control improvements are fully operational.  
BCCA / SCN have recruited resident volunteers to monitor odor conditions surrounding the plant. Since the odor control improvements went into place, we have had reports that odor conditions have significantly improved and no reports of odor conditions. BCCA / SCN will work with residents to continue to monitor into the warmer months.
- Follow up on NCDEQ Frequency Violations.  
ONSWC received frequency violations from NCDEQ for their January, April and June 2022 nDMR reports. ONSWC performed the tests in January, but they were not received by NCDEQ. ONSWC is resubmitting. John will provide the BCCA with a copy of their submission to NCDEQ on all three of these violations.
- Reclaimed Water Spray Irrigation  
In mid-December, Package H (wooded area located south and west of the Western Retention Pond) has been approved by NCDEQ. This brings the total reclaimed water spray irrigation system to 442,687gpd. This expansion of the spray irrigation system was necessary to meet increased volume as the final homes, townhomes and commercial development for Briar Chapel come online.
- Annual Report  
ONSWC will provide the BCCA with an Annual Report at the end of January providing an update on operations of the Briar Chapel wastewater system in 2022.

### 3. BCCA Update—Liz Rolison

- Feedback on Odor Control Improvements

Feedback has been positive as noted above. BCCA / SCN will continue to work with residents to monitor into the warmer months and provide ONSWC continued feedback.

- Irrigation During Freezing Temps

BCCA noted irrigation during recent freezing temperatures along Briar Chapel Parkway coming into the community. Irrigation was causing roadway icing and large chunks of ice surrounding spray heads. ONSWC was notified and found a communication issue that was causing the system to run. The problem has been corrected.

- Retention Pond Levels

BCCA has noted that the Central and Western Retention Pond levels have been notably higher than last year and asked if ONSWC has sufficient storage capacity as we go through the winter months. John confirmed that they are continuing to run spray irrigation during the day to maintain and lower levels.
